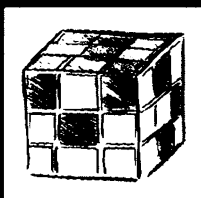
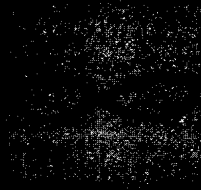
Evidence-Based Medicine
